



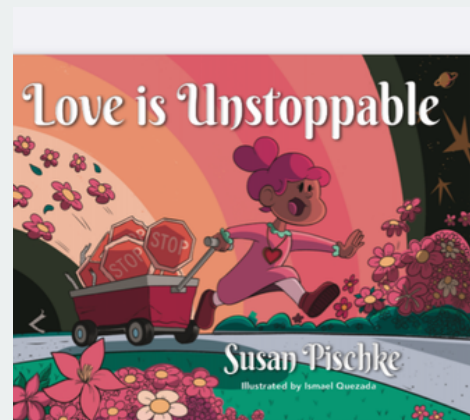

# Teacher's Guide for 4–6

## Love is Unstoppable

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**Themes:** Love, Compassion, Spiritual Growth, Reflection, Empathy, Forgiveness

### Before Reading

#### For Discussion

- What is love?
- What does “unstoppable love” mean to you?
- Do you think love can change the way we see or experience the world? Why or why not?
- What do you think the world would be like if everyone acted from love?

#### Activities

- Word Web: Brainstorm associations with the word “LOVE.” Create a visual web.
  - Journal Prompt: Write about a time you felt deeply loved or showed love to someone.
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### During Reading

#### Break reading into 5 parts:

- Suzanna's dissatisfaction and search → pages 1-5
- Meeting David and Father Love → pages 6-10
- Mother Earth and emotional awakening → pages 11-15
- The Comforter and reflection → pages 16-22
- Understanding and transformation → pages 23-29

### For Discussion

- What is Suzanna feeling in this part of the story?
- What lesson is she learning from the person or spirit she meets?
- What metaphor or symbol do you notice, and what could it represent?
- On page 5, if we change the word “piece” to “peace” how would that change the meaning?

### Activities

- **Character Map:** Track Suzanna’s emotional growth. List who she meets and what she learns from each.
  - **Symbol Scavenger Hunt:** Identify symbols like “the wind,” “the Living Tree,” “the comforter.” What do they represent?
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## After Reading

### For Discussion

- How did Suzanna change from the beginning to the end?
- Which lesson about love stood out to you the most? Why?
- What is the main message of the book?
- What part of Suzanna’s journey do you connect with the most?
- Why do you think the author wrote this book?

### Activities

- **Heart Map of Love:** Draw a heart and fill it with different forms of love from the story (e.g., patience, forgiveness, kindness).
- **Creative Writing:** Imagine meeting your own spirit guide. What do they teach you about love?
- **Acts of Love Challenge:** Notice students performing acts of love and note the act on a heart. Then post it on a “Love is Unstoppable” wall.
- **Quote Reflection:** Choose a “LOVE IS...” line to illustrate or reflect on in writing.



## Extension Ideas

- **Drama/Skits:** Reenact moments from the story. Focus on emotional expression.
- **Media Literacy:** Create visual representations of key “LOVE IS...” themes.
- **Soundtrack of the Spirit:** Choose a song that connects to the story’s themes and explain your choice.
